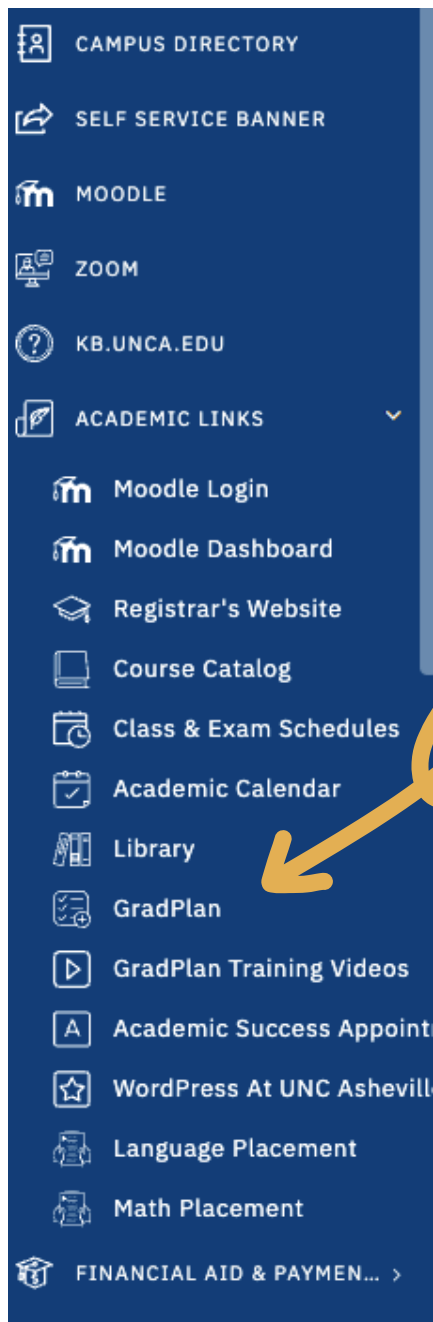




Using Gradplan to Create YOUR SCHEDULE
